**Plan to tour the Haupt-Yehl  
House Museum**

This house, built by Nicholas Haupt in 1888 and originally located at 6025 Lincoln Avenue in Morton Grove, was relocated to Harrer Park in 1984. This farmhouse, typical of the homes of Morton Grove's early settlers in the turn-of-the-century, is furnished with artifacts representing life from the mid to late 1800's through the early 1900's. Don't miss our annual exhibit, Main Street Morton Grove, in the lower level of the museum on your visit. Get a feel for the old-time streets of Morton Grove while enjoying our blacksmith shop, general store, early farming history, floral industry, and more. Museum tours, programs and events are made available to the community through a partnership between the Morton Grove Historical Society and the Morton Grove Park District.

Welcome signs from the Netherlands, brush silk painting from China, henna tattooing from India, and story embroidery from Guatemala. Open to all ages. Children need to be accompanied by an adult. **Energy and Conservation through  
the Centuries  
Museum Tour and Education Center  
Power House Experiments  
Saturday, March 13th from 1-3:00 pm**

Join us for a special guided tour of the Haupt-Yehl House museum as we explore energy use and conservation in the 19th and 20th centuries. The museum exhibits energy sources from wood burning stoves and coal fueled heat to gas and electric power. Conservation practices used included cisterns to collect water for everyday use and the practice of turning rags into rugs and quilts. Step into our Museum Education Center following this guided tour as we explore energy alternatives and conservation choices of the 21st Century. Join us as we experiment with solar and wind power, demonstrated with the Power House- sustainable living in the 21st Century educational kit. Learn about our Education Center rain barrel and rain garden, demonstrating the conservation of natural resources today. Fun for the entire family.

**Linne Woods Bird Walk  
Saturday, May 15, 2010 from 8-10am**



Join Marian Thill, certified naturalist and member of Friends of the Morton Grove Forest Preserves, on a Bird Walk in Morton Grove's own backyard, Linne Woods. Come out to see who's been migrating through our village, including scarlet tanagers, indigo buntings, Baltimore orioles and many warbler species. By summer these visitors have passed us by, so join Marian and members of the Morton Grove Historical Museum staff for this special program. The entrance to Linne Woods is on the north side of Dempster across from Ferris Avenue in Morton Grove. Drive past the 2nd pavilion and park near the turn-around. Although not strenuous, this activity requires some walking. An adult legal guardian must accompany children under 18 years of age. No pets allowed. This program may be canceled in the case of inclement weather.
